

ARCHDIOCESE OF OMAHA REVIEW BOARD

The Archbishop of Omaha appointed the 11-member Review Board. It was determined that the majority should be lay persons, none of whom were to be in the employ of the archdiocese. Members serve without compensation, except for reimbursement for expenses. At least one member is to be an experienced and respected pastor. Members are appointed for a five-year term. This appointment can be renewed for another five years. Present members of the board are:

The Rev. Dan Andrews is the pastor and executive director of the Omaha St. John Paul II Newman Center. Ordained in 2001, Father Andrews has served as pastor and associate pastor at several urban and rural parishes.

Nancy Berg spent 35 years as a Catholic school educator at St. Mary School in O'Neill, Nebraska. She has served her parish in several ways, including as president of the School Advisory Board, parish council, pastoral planning committee, EMHC, lector, and cantor. Ms. Berg is a survivor of clerical abuse. She and her husband have three sons and nine grandchildren.

Jim Bogner spent 27 years with the FBI. He was the special agent in charge of nine FBI offices in Nebraska and Iowa. Mr. Bogner led the FBI's Internal Affairs Unit in Washington, D.C. He is a member of the United States Catholic Bishops National Review Board. Mr. Bogner is an EMHC and reader for St. Vincent de Paul Parish. He is a member of the Knights of Columbus. He is married and has two children.

Dr. C. Timothy Dickel is a professor of education (1976 to present) and a former professor of psychiatry (2005-2010) at Creighton University. Additionally, Dr. Dickel served as the co-director of Creighton University's "Creighton Study of Violence Across the Life Span" from 2008-2010 and as a member of the Board of the Domestic Violence Coordinating Council of Omaha from 2006-2016. He continues to research the impact of violence exposure across the lifespan. Dr. Dickel was a member of the Archdiocesan School Board from 1993-1999. He and his wife are members of Saint John Parish on the Creighton University campus, and they have three children and ten grandchildren.

Dr. Stephen Doran is a neurosurgeon with Midwest Neurosurgery & Spine Specialists. In his professional practice, Dr. Doran has treated victims of child abuse. Dr. Doran was the founding president of the Nebraska Coalition for Ethical Research. He was ordained a permanent deacon in 2021. He and his wife Sharon have five sons.

Betty Getzfred is a retired principal of Pope John XXIII Central Catholic Junior/Senior High School in Elgin. She has over 40 years of experience in education. She was named Great Plains Teacher of the Year, Archdiocese of Omaha Teacher of the Year, and the Archdiocese of Omaha Administrator of the Year. She is the past president of the Elgin Chamber of Commerce, an EMHC at St. Boniface Parish, and served on pastoral planning committees.

Matthew T. Huss, Ph.D., is a Professor of Psychological Science at Creighton University and a licensed psychologist specializing in forensic psychology. He conducts forensic psychological evaluations and has provided expert testimony in legal proceedings. He and his wife are members of Mary Our Queen Parish, where he has been active on the school board and in coaching.

Greg London has served with Sarpy County Sheriff's Office since 1988. On January 7, 2025, the Sarpy County Commissioners appointed London as the 26th Sheriff of Sarpy County. Sheriff London holds a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice and a Master of Public Administration. Both degrees were earned at the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO). In March 2019, the UNO School of Criminology and Criminal Justice presented London their annual Alumni Achievement Award. Additionally, London completed the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Program, and he graduated from the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. Sheriff London received Governor appointments to the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory Council (PSAC) and the Nebraska Interstate Compact Council. He is a parishioner at St. Columbkille Catholic Church in Papillion.

John Reisz has been a Deputy Sarpy County Attorney for over 27 years and has served as a criminal prosecutor, handling misdemeanor and felony cases. He currently supervises the county attorney's civil division, where his practice includes mental health/dangerous sex offender commitments. He also serves as a Judge Advocate General in the United States Army Reserve and Creighton University School of Law graduate. John is a member of St. Matthew Parish in Bellevue and Knights of Columbus.

Jaqueline Simmons is a member of St. James Parish, and she has over 40 years of experience in the human services/child welfare fields. She is currently employed at St. Francis Ministries. She has served on the Metropolitan Child Advocacy Coalition, Sarpy County Through the Eyes of Child Court Improvement Project, Douglas County Court Collaboration Project, UNO School of Social Work Advisory Committee, and Archdiocese of Omaha Anti-pornography Task Force.

Dr. Terence L. Zach, M.D., is the chairman of the Department of Pediatrics at Creighton University School of Medicine. Dr. Zach is a neonatal medicine expert. He graduated from the University of Nebraska College of Medicine in 1983. He is a member of St. Leo Parish in Omaha.
